
### **ECG QUIZ**

Re: Prospective study of etiological factors in non-deflatable Foleys urethral catheters and evaluation of a deflation technique. Tariq Mufti et al JAMC, 1988 1. 22-24.

The authors have very rightly pointed out that the balloon channel gets blocked from within as a result of salts in the water from the steriliser. Distilled water will prevent this happening. One should specially guard against use of saline to fill the balloon as this will increase the risk of channel clogging crystals. An additional method we used to deflate balloons is to cut the catheter across and pass a ureteric catheter-stylet into the fine channel thus unblocking it. In order to avoid the chemical cystitis from use of ether used to 'burst' the balloon, initial filling of the bladder with 200 c.c. water will prevent direct contact of ether with the bladder

We have tried this method in many of our cases and the direct puncture technique was applied to only those cases where stylet method proved to be failure. I am grateful for his valuable suggestions on how to avoid chemical cystitis following injection of either in the balloons.

Gravest Public Health Hazard and Clean Water

(i) Global nuclear arsenals now

total the equivalent of over 16,000,000,000, tones of TNT, or roughly four tons of dynamite for every man, woman and child on this planet.

(ii) A single submarine-launched Trident missile carries eight times the total firepower used in World War II, enough to destroy every major city in the northern

hemisphere.

(iii) In one 18-month period at the beginning of the decade there were 3,703 false nuclear attack alerts, 147 deemed serious, due to technical malfunctions.

- (iv) Of the nearly 300 doctors in Hiroshima at the time the world's first nuclear bomb was dropped, only 28 were left alive and sufficiently uninjured to attend the 100,000 injured while 42 out of the city's 45 hospitals were destroyed or rendered useless.
- (v) Today there is one soldier for every 200 people and only one physician for every 1,670 people.
- (vi) Providing clean water to all human beings and thereby removing the causes of 80% of illness in the world would cost the equivalent of five months of global military expenditure.
